Scott rarely talks about the negative experience of growing up poor in a small alley in the Allendale community back in the 1960s but acknowledges that sometimes humble beginnings are the foundation of our growth as productive citizens.

Scott remembers an experience at the age of five when Shreveport police stormed her home in the middle of the night with flashlights and guns drawn. “They were looking for my older brother because someone had broken into the neighborhood store and stolen cookies. My brother was snatched out of the bed and taken to jail without any evidence,” she recounts.

My mother—a single parent of six—was helpless and could not afford to make the bail. My brother was only released from jail after someone broke into the store again a few days later. Because of his bad experiences in Allendale as a child, my brother left home for New York, never to return.

My family’s negative encounter with law enforcement caused me to fear police officers. Moreover, I refuse to steal because jail was no place for me. I grew up wanting to change the stigma of police officers. Consequently, a probation and parole officer for the state of Louisiana was my first job after college and later law school. My desire was to be a good example of law enforcement, help reform criminal offenders, and to lend a helping hand for second chances. My firm helped raise over 200,000 for Shreveport police officers body cameras to help keep officers accountable.

Sometimes poverty or injustice keeps us from doing what is right; however, I was taught that everyone deserves respect and dignity. Injustice sometimes was a way of life in our community. My mom always taught me to take a negative and turn bad things into positives, and to stay on the right side of the law. That’s what I’ve always tried to do in my career. Having honesty and integrity has resulted in great outcomes in just about every legal case be it civil or criminal.

Scott believes that the longevity of practicing law and building strong, trusting relationships is a key to success. To date she has served over 25,000 clients, and prides herself on offering competitive rates. Additionally Scott has expounded approximately 5,000 criminal records. Scott says she has been blessed, and with her blessing she can afford to give back by offering reasonable and negotiable fees to clients. “Since there are many offenders who cannot afford to pay for representation, I often find myself discounting fees to those in need.”

Scott is known for her ability to work personal injury cases, holding insurance companies accountable for taking advantage of individuals, resulting in the millions of dollars. She has also made her mark on the municipal bond industry by being hired to work on over a billion dollars in municipal bond transactions.
